

I William Isabell of the Town of Alexandria being extremely weak in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament, namely I direct that out of my personal Estate all my own just debts shall be first paid that my servant Girl married Mary shall be free after the term of ten years during which period she is to serve my friend Edward & Mary whom I hereby nominate and appoint my Executor. In Testamentary which I have hereunto put my hand this eighth day of March 1827

Published and declared by William Isabell to be his last Will and Testament before us who have signed our names in presence of the Testator and in presence of each other as Witnesses thereto.

With respect to the residue of my Estate I direct that one third thereof to be equally divided between John and Richard Isabell and Catherine Hicks who are residents in England and related to me the two first named being Brothers and the last a Sister Schuler and one third whereof I leave to the Children of Richard Howell and the remaining third to Edward & Mary and Jonathan O. May.

Turlane are held and jointly bound unto John Watts Esq Judge of the Orphans Court of Alexandria County in the District of Columbia and his successors in Office in the sum of three thousand dollars law full money of the United States to the payment whereof well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 1st day of March 1827.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Edward & Mary shall well and truly perform the office of Executor of William Isabell late of Alexandria County deceased according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duty of him or her by law as Executor aforesaid without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful performance of said office then the above obligation to be void else remain in full force and virtue in law
