It is my intention that in the first place, that all my just and lawful debts shall be paid, after which I give and bequeath unto my wife Charlotte Hammond, the whole of the property I now own may hereafter purchase, consisting at present of all my wearing apparel, household and kitchen furniture, the monies now in my possession as what may be due to me now or hereafter, whether by note bond or open account; as also I will and bequeath to my wife Charlotte Hammond the half of the Schooner Betsey and Charlotte of Baltimore that is owned jointly by said William Ball of Baltimore & myself together with all vessels or parts of vessels that I may own hereafter, here, or elsewhere, making her my sole Prerogative legatee of what I now or may hereafter be possessed of. And I appoint Mr. William Ball of the City and County of Baltimore my only executor of this my last will and testament.
