and publish this my last Will Testament, hereby revoking all former wills  
hereof made by me at any time or place whatever. It is my intention  
that in the first place, that all my just and lawful debts shall be paid, after  
which I give and bequeath unto my wife Charlotte Lammont, the sale  
of the property I now doas may hereafter possess, consisting at present of all  
my writing apparel, household and kitchen furniture, the monies necessary  
to my profession or what may be due to me now or hereafter; whether by  
suits, bonds or other account, as also well and bequeath to my wife Chas-  
lette Lammont the half of the Schooner Betsy and Charlotte of Baltimore  
that is owned jointly by me William Ball of Baltimore & myself  
together with all rights or parts of rights that I may own hereafter, here,  
or elsewhere, making her my sole residuary legatee of what I now or may  
hereafter be possessed of. And I appoint Mr. William Ball of the  
City and County of Baltimore my only testator of this my last Will and  
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seal this fifth day of December in the year of our Lord  
1804.
