In the Name of God Amen I Alexander Latimer of the
Town of Alexandria, calling to mind the uncertainty of this life, and
being now of sound mind and perfect recollection, do make and ordain
this to be my last will and Testament. In the first place I recommend
my Soul to God who gave it to me and I request that my body be
buried in a decent manner at the expense of my estate; as to the
property which I have pleased God to bestow on me I dispose of it as
follows

I Give and Bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Mercy all my Estate
both real and personal during her natural life I mean by this devise to include
all my estate of every description whatever including my money as well as
all the real or personal property of which I may die possessed. After the death
of my wife It is my will and desire that in case any relation or relations of
mine should come to this Country and claim my estate within five years from
the time of the Death of my said wife that their estate before given to
my wife shall belong to such relation or relations and their heirs forever.
But in case such relation or relations should not come and make the claim
within the time aforesaid then and in that case it is my will and desire that
the said Estate shall go to the legal Heirs or Representatives of my said wife
forever. I hereby constitute and appoint my dear beloved wife Mercy sole
Executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal, and published this my last Will and Testament
this fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and four
