The Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above Bound Nathaniel Longden, Executor of the last will and Testament of Adam Longden Deceased, do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Nathaniel Longden or into the hands and possession of any other persons or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, at such time as he shall be thereto required by the said Court; and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, do well and truly administer according to Law, and further do make a just and true account of his doings and doings therein, when thereto required by the said Court; and also shall well and truly pay and Deliver all the Legacies contained in the said last will and Testament; as far as the said Goods, Chattels and Credits, will thereto extend and the Law shall charge then this obligation to be void and of none effect else to remain in full force and virtue

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above Bound Richard Wightman Administrator of all and Singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Ann M^{rs} Daniel Deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator, or into the hands & possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the said Orphans Court when thereto required by the said Court, and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law, and further do make a just and true account of all his doings and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods, Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court, for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his Letter of Administration, then this obligation else to remain in
