At a session of the Cyphans Court for the County of Alexandria the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1802. A certified copy of the last Will and Testament of Bartholomew Randridge deceased (in the French Language) was produced into Court by Citizen Commarque the Executor therein named, which was ordered to be recorded - and at the same time a translation of the same was made by the said Commarque which was also ordered to be recorded, and his petition concerning the will in French -

And the said Citizen Commarque saith that an Inventory was taken of property in the possession of the said deceased which consisted partly of his own property but a much greater part of other persons, such as Carriages and many other things, in which no discrimination was made. It is therefore ordered that the said Inventory be filed and remain with the Will, and other papers of the Deceased, as it cannot with propriety be recorded as an Inventory of his Estate.
