Paton and John Janney are held and firmly Bound unto George
Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of
Alexandria in the District of Columbia ^{and his successors in office} in the sum of eight
Thousand Dollars to the payment whereof well and truly to be
made to the said Judge and his Successors in office we bind
ourselves our heirs, Executors and administrators, jointly and
severally firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and
Dated this twenty first day of June 1803

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above
Bind Samuel Craig Executor of the last Will and Testament of
William Mitchell Preesedo do make or cause to be made
a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels
and Credits of the said Preesedo, which have or shall come to
the hands possession or knowledge of the said Samuel Craig
or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for
him, and the same so made do exhibit unto the orphans Court
for the County of Alexandria, at such times as he shall be
there required by the said Court, and the same Goods, Chattels
and Credits and all other the Goods, chattels and Credits of the
said Preesedo, which at any time hereafter shall come to the
hands possession or knowledge of the said Samuel Craig
or into the hands and possession of any other persons or

persons for him dowell and truly administer according to law, and
further do make a just and true Account of his actions and doings
therein when thereto required by the said Court, and also shall well
and truly pay and Deliver all the legacies contained and specified
in the said last Will and Testament, as far as the said Goods
Chattels and Credits will thence be extend and the law shall charge;

Then this obligation to be void and of none effect also to remain in full
force and Virtue
