made oath upon the Holy Evangelists of almighty God that John
Watson note to William Chapman deceased, was in the life
time of the said William Chapman, paid thro' the hands and by
the means of the said John Gadsby, and that the said Chapman
acknowledged the payment but omitted or neglected to give up
the Note; Wherefore being found among his papers was here-
in inventoried as apart of his Estate, altho' nothing if it is due.

Memorandum - By the within Inventory and the Deceased
Bank Books it appeared that the Bank of Alexandria owed
him the sum of \$2366 ⁷/₁₀₀, but upon a settlement of the admin-
istrators with the Bank, there was due the Deceased only
\$336 ⁷/₁₀₀, the Bank having Produced Checks which make
the difference and which were not credited by the Deceased &
which are herewith filed and referred to Also were in-
ventoried two Checks of Charles Sumner drawn in favour of
the Deceased William Chapman, the said Sumner being
also dead and the money not collected, which checks are

for \$100 each, dated 23th of February 1800, the other 20 sets but no year
mentioned - Also Jonathan Davis note for \$40, dated 30th Novr 1799
and Jesse Simms Check for \$50 dated 2^d July 1800, none of which
are paid, the parties hitherto having been deemed Insolvent, which is
the reason they have not been collected - Also John Gadsbys note Credited
by John Fitzgerald for \$121 dated 19th March 1799, Credit for which
with Interest making \$200, is given in John Gadsbys account previous
to the Death of Chapman, and John overalls Judgment for £48s 10⁷
with costs assigned to the Dec^d Dec^r 12th 1799, also credited in Gadsbys
Account as before mentioned -
