The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Thomas Smith Guardian of Margaret Worthall his Executors and Administrators do and shall well and truly pay unto the said Orphan as such Estate and Estate is now or hereafter shall come to the hands and possession of the said Thomas Smith as soon as the said Orphan attains the lawful age, or when those required by the said Court shall well and truly save harmless and indemnify the said George Griffin and his Successors from all trouble and damages that shall in any manner about the said Estate then this Obligation to be void and of none effect else to remain in full force and virtue.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Anna Lake Administratrix of said and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Captain Penn deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Anna Lake or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her and the same be made do deliver unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when those required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattels and Credits as well and truly Administer according to Law and further do make a just and true Account of all her dealings and things therein when those required by the said Court and all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon Account of the said Administratrix the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the same being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administratrix do in such case being required by the Court deliver up her letters of Administration then this Obligation to be void else to remain in full force.
