Mandeville are held and firmly bound to George Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, in the District of Columbia and his Successors in Office; in the sum of five thousand dollars; For which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors in Office, we bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated the thirtieth day of September 1809.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound John Mandeville Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattels and credits of Jonathan Mandeville

Deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator; or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the orphans Court of the said County, when thereto required by the said Court; And the same Goods, Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to law; And further do make a just and true account of all his actings and doings therein, when thereto required by the said Court; and all the rest of the said Goods, Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator; the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being; shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law; and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased, and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof; and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his Letters of Administration; then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force.
