Know all men by these presents that we Matthew Robinson and Guy Atkinson, are held and firmly Bound to George Gelpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia, and his successors in office in the sum of four thousand Dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his successors hereinbefore mentioned, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these Presents sealed with our Seals and dated the 14th Day of June 1803. The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Matthew Robinson, administrator of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Thomas Kewelin deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which Inventories shall come into the hands possession or knowledge of the said Matthew Robinson or into the hands a possession of any person or persons for him, and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, when thereunto required by the said Court, & the same Goods, Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law, and further to make a just and true Account of all his acts and doings therein when thereunto required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods, Chattels, and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon Account of the said Administration the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such

persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the Probate thereof, and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his Letters of Administration, then this obligation to be void also remain in full force.
