I David Thompson Tutor, do make and Publish my last Will and Testament in the manner & form following, to-wit:-
 First, it is my wish that Robert B. Jameson Merchant of Alexandria, should immediately on receiving the information of my death send my Father & Mother Samuel & Jane Thompsons twelve ^{to each of my Father Samuel & Mother Jane Jameson} English Guineas that is six to each, to each of my Sisters Jane, Margaret & Kelly, six Guineas & should any of them be dead or Resided out of the Kingdom and no probability of their returning in a short time, their part to be equally distributed amongst the rest, these Monies intended for the purpose of defraying their Expenses in coming to America should they think proper. Secondly that tract of Land formerly the property of James Lyons which I purchased of Regins & Weston was the Son of Cincinnati to be at the sole disposal and use of my Father and Mother Samuel & Jane Thompsons during their natural lives only. Thirdly that that Tract of Land which I purchased of Samuel Bright, lying on the lower side of the East fork of Little Miami, being part of a Military Warrant in the name of John Braushardt, is to be jointly held and for the joint use of such of my Brothers and Sisters as may Emigrate to America, during the natural lives of my Father and Mother, and at the Death of my Father and Mother, all the Lands I possess are to be equally divided, ^{amongst my} Brothers and Sisters, the said Dividends to be further sole use and behoof their Wives & Assigns forever.
 Fourthly That in my Father and Mother, Brothers & Sisters settling on the Lands herein before mentioned, I bequeath five hundred Dollars for the purpose of improving and shooting said Farms, in the following manner, Namely two hundred Dollars to my Father & Mother and three hundred Dollars to my Brothers and Sisters, and to be appropriated solely for the purposes aforesaid. Fifth that the residue of my Money after paying my just Debts and the bequest herein before mentioned

to be equally divided, Between my Mother Jane Thompson & my three Sisters Informant, and in case of the Death of my Mother, her part to be given to my Sisters, and in case of the Death of either of my Sisters, her part to be given to her Children if she should have any, if not to my other Sisters -

Truly, I do constitute and appoint my Friends Robert B. Jameson Merchant of Alexandria, & Caleb Swan, Pay Master General for the Army of the United States my true and Lawfull Executors, and as I have a firm reliance on the integrity of these Men, I trust they will carry this my last Will and Testament into complete effect according to the true intent and meaning thereof.

At a Session of the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria the 23rd day of November 1802: This last will and Testament of David Thompson deceased, together with the certificate thereon, were produced into Court by Caleb Swan one of the Executors, then in said Court, and ordered to be recorded; and at the same time the said Caleb Swan announced his Executorship in the following words: "I Caleb Swan one of the Executors named in and by the last will and Testament of David Thompson deceased do hereby relinquish and renounce my right of Executorship therein" Given under my hand and Seal this 17th day of November 1802

Also appeared in Court Robert Brown Jamieson the other Executor named in the said will and announced his Executorship in the following words: "I Robert Brown Jamieson of Alexandria one of the Executors appointed in the last will and Testament of David Thompson deceased, do hereby refuse to act by virtue of such appointment, and do therefore renounce all my right, title and claim to the said Executorship."

Whereupon administration with the will annexed of the said David Thompson was granted to George Stothard and Jane his wife/sister of the said David Thompson, they having given security according to Law

Renewall Menly then presents that the George Stothard, Jane Stothard, James Patton and Robert Brown Jamieson are held and firmly bound to George Gelpin Esquire Judge of the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia, and his Successors in office in the sum of four thousand Dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors, we Bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these presents, Sealed with our Seals and dated the 23rd day of November 1802

The Conditions of the above Obligation is such that if the above Bounden George and Jane Stothard Administrators and administrators of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits with the will annexed of David Thompson deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said Deceased which have or shall come to the Hands possession or knowledge of the said George and Jane Stothard or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them, and the same so made do exhibit unto the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court, and the same goods, Chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to Law, and make a just and true account of their doings therein when thereto required by the said Court.

And further do well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said will so far as the said goods, Chattels and credits will extend according to the value thereof and the Law shall charge, then this Obligation to be void else remain in full force
