In the Name of God Amen, I Dennis Scott of Upper Marlborough in the County of Prince Georges in the State of Maryland, being Sick and Weak in Body but of Sound and disposing mind and Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following, hereby revoking and annulling my Brother Manasse Scott sole Executor thereof and revoking all others heretofore made by me - I give and devise and Bequeath all my property, Real, Personal or mixed whatsoever and wheresoever to my four Brothers and two Sisters, to wit, Charles Scott Junr, Manasse Scott, John Scott, Elisha Scott, Rebecca Mulletta Scott, and Elizabeth Scott, to them their Heirs and Assigns forever, in such parts and proportions both as to real and Personal Estate, or either, as my Father Charles Scott, Senior, shall direct, by writing under his hand and Seal or by his last will and Testament, it being my desire that such division and allotment should be made, equally to their respective Wives and Heirs of which I constitute my

Father the sole Judge, but in case my said Father should, depart this life, without having made the division aforesaid, then by Writing under his hand and Seal or his last will and Testament, then my Will is that my Property aforesaid, shall descend to my said Brothers and Sisters equally in Fee Simple as Tenants in common and not as Joint Tenants. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Eighth day of March in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and two.
