I give and devise and Bequeath all my property, Real, Personal or mixed whatsoever and wheresoever to my four Brothers and two Sisters, to wit, Charles Scott Junr., Mansah Scott, John Scott, Elisha Scott, Rebecca Maboda Scott, and Elizabeth Scott, to them their Heirs and Assigns forever in such parts and proportions both as to real and Personal Estate, or either, as my Brother Charles Scott, Junr. shall direct, by writing under his hand and Seal or by his last will and Testament, it being my desire that such division and Settlement should be made, agreeably to their respective Wants and Merits of which to constitute my

Father the sole Judge, but in case my said Father should, depart this life, without having made the division aforesaid, either by Writing under his hand and Seal or his last will and Testament, then my Will is that my Property aforesaid, shall descend to my said Brothers and Sisters equally in the simple as I would in common and not as Joint Tenants. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Eighth day of March in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and two.
