The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound William Devote Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of John Fowler deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court; and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law; And further do make a just and true account of all his acting and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court; And also the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Adminis^{trator} the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as we are entitled to the same by law and if it shall ^{hereafter} appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his Letters of Administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force
