firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and dated  
this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1806.

The Condition of the above obligation is  
such that if the above bound Eve Boyer Guardian of Elizabeth Duncap  
her Executrix and Administratrix do and shall well and truly pay unto the  
said Orphan all such Estate and Estates as now is or hereafter shall  
come to the hands and possession of the said Guardian when the said  
Orphan shall attain lawful age & when there required by the said Court  
and also shall well and truly save harmless and indemnify the said Judge  
of the said Court and his successors in office from all trouble and damage  
that shall or may arise about the said Estate then this obligation to be void  
to remain in full force.

the uncertainty of the transitory life, do make & obtain this my last will  
and Testament. Hst.

I first recommend my soul to God trusting in his mercy for the  
pardon & forgiveness of all my sins through the merits of Jesus Christ  
my Saviour & Redeemer.

Brick ware house & back buildings thereto situate on the west side of  
Union Street, bounded on the south side by the house of Joseph Wilburn  
on the north side by the warehouse & lot of Thomas Swain. Also my lot of ground  
situate & lying on the North side of King street & west side of Union street now in the  
tenure of Andrew Fleming to him & his heirs forever. Also one vacant lot of ground  
containing one quarter of an acre being a moiety of one half acre purchased of  
Abley Young of the state of Maryland. Also the house & lot on Water Street  
& on the south side of Lewis Weston's brick house & which I bought of Alexander  
McConnell. All the aforesaid property of every description, situate and  
being in the Town of Alexandria I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Duncap  
aforesaid. I do hereby constitute & appoint Robert Moore, Samuel Craig & William Herbst  
Executors of this my last Will & Testament. Witness to my hand & seal  
this 29<sup>th</sup> day of October 1806.
