Hunt and David Jenkins are heirs and jointly bound to George Gifford Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the district of Columbia and his successors in office in the sum of five thousand dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his successors in office we bind ourselves and heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated and dated this 7th day of August 1807. The conditions of the above obligation is such that if the above named Elizabeth Richardson Administratrix and Co-Administratrix the goods chattels and credits of James Richardson deceased do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administratrix or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law and further do make as just and true account of her actions and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court and all the rest of the said goods chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administratrix the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executors obtain a certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administratrix or such can being required by the Court deliver up his letters of Administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

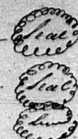

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the district of Columbia the 14th day of September 1807- This inventory and appraisement of Robert Richardson's estate was returned by the Administrator & ordered to be recorded.

In the Name of God - Amen. I Nelson Reed of the County of Fairfax and Parish of Fairfax and State of Virginia Planter, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain constitute and appoint this my last will and testament in me and for as follows - I then give and bequeath my soul to God in hope of a glorious resurrection through the merits of my blessed Redeemer and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors. My will and desire is that the money due me and arising from the sale of land in Ann Arundel county & State of Maryland, should be put to interest, which Interest together with all my moveable property whatsoever I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Reed during her natural life as widowhood, and in consequence of her marriage or death I give the aforesaid money to my sons, James, Nelson, William, the said sons, Isaac and John, to be equally divided amongst them, to them and their heirs. And in consequence of son William's not returning I give and bequeath his divided of the aforesaid money to my aforesaid sons, to be equally divided amongst them, to them and to their heirs -

I give and bequeath to my son Nelson, one Cow and calf, two Bows and lambs and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs. The remaining part of my household furniture and live stock all and every part thereof I give and bequeath to my four daughters, Rebecca, Anne, Dinah and Jane, to be equally divided amongst them at the marriage or death of my wife - Lastly I appoint my son Nelson Reed and my wife Rebecca to be my executors of this my last will and testament, nothing all other by me hereby made - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of February one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight -
