

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia, the 8th day of August 1809, This Estate account of Rebecca Smith deceased, was returned by the Executor and ordered to be recorded

I Charles Wadsworth a Citizen of the United States of America, of the City of Hartford in the State of Connecticut, now resident at Alexandria in the district of Columbia, being of sound mind and perfect memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

First: - It is my Will that after my death all my debts and Funeral charges, shall be justly and honourably paid -

Secondly: I give and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth Wadsworth one thousand dollars worth of Furniture to be appraised by three Persons, - Of the residue of my estate, it is my will that my said wife Elizabeth, in case she survive me, shall receive one third part, whether, Real, personal or mixed, to her sole use and benefit, during her natural life, then to descend together with the Furniture above mentioned, to my legal heirs, including, among them, my daughter Julia Ann Wadsworth, to be equally divided -

Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my Mother Abigail Wadsworth of Hartford Connecticut, during her natural life, an annuity of two hundred dollars, to be paid to her drafts semi annually by my Executor.

Fourthly - The residue of my estate, it is my will, shall be equally divided among my legal heirs, including my said daughter Julia Ann Wadsworth -

Fifthly - It is my Will, that in case I should have no more Children, at my death than the said Julia Ann Wadsworth

And in case my said daughter Julia Ann should die before my said Wife Elizabeth, one half of my estate shall be vested in my widow Elizabeth, during her life, and the other half in my sister Mary Wadsworth of Hartford Connecticut. Sixthly - I do constitute and appoint James Patton Esquire of Alexandria aforesaid Merchant, together with my said Wife Elizabeth, my Executor and Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, - -

Know all Men by these presents that we James Patton, Tho. mas Lawrason, and William Towle, are held and firmly bound unto George Giffin Esquire, Judge of the orphans court for the county of Alexandria, in the district of Columbia, and his Successors in office in the sum of five thousand dollars, to the payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said Judge, and his Successors in office, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated the twenty first day of August 1809,

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bound James Patton Executor of the last Will and Testament of Charles Wadsworth deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Executor, or into the hands and possession of any other Person or persons for him; and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, when thereto required by the said Court, and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all other the goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which at any time hereafter, shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Executor, or into the hands and

Possession of any other Person or persons for him, do well and truly administer according to law, and further do, make a just and true account of all his actings and doings therein, when thereto required by the said Court, and also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said last Will and Testament, as far as the said Goods, Chattels and Credits will therein to extend, and the Law shall charge - Then this Obligation to be void and of none effect; else to remain in full force and virtue
