All the rest & residue of my Estate both real & personal of what nature it kind & interest may be not herein before particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided between my two Sons William Henry Washington & George Alexander Washington which I give to them their Heirs Executors administrators & assigns forever. And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my Nephews & Friends Charles Davis of Loudoun County & George Chapman Junr of Woodrowville in the County of Prince William both in the State of Virginia Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby renouncing all the aforesaid Will & Testament by me heretofore made.
