Item I order and direct for the purposes of paying my debts and funeral expenses that all my personal and as much of my real Estate as may be necessary be sold by my Executors and Executrix herein after mentioned or such of them as may act and the survivors or survivor of such acting Executors

Item I give and devise one third part of the Remainder of my real estate to my wife Elizabeth during her natural life and the residue of that remainder and the third part of it herely given my wife for life after her death I give and devise unto my said Children Fanny, William, Mary, Eliza, George and Robert their Heirs and Assigns for ever to be equally divided among them but it is my will and desire and I herely direct that such division be not made till my youngest child comes of age, and it is my particular desire & request that all my tools be given to my son William & I herely give and bequeath the same unto him

Lastly I nominate and appoint my brother William M: Munn and my friend Mordecai Miller Executors and my wife Elizabeth Executrix of this my last will and Testament, and I do herely revoke all former and other Wills by me heretofore made declaring this and no other to be my last will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this tenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ten
