Craik, all my personal Estate; I also give and devise unto her in Fee Simple, fifty acres of Land, situate, lying and being on Potomack River, at the mouth of Hunting Creek; and adjoining to the Land, now in the possession of my Father Jas. Craik; leaving it to my beloved Father James Craik, to make such further provision for her; and my beloved Son James Craik in his Will, as he may think proper, from the part intended for me; And should it be necessary that a Guardian be appointed for my beloved

Son James Craik, It is my wish and desire, that my beloved Father James Craik, or my beloved Mother Mariamne Craik do undertake it - Lastly I appoint my beloved Wife Maria D. Craik sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament; and it is my desire that she may not be obliged to give security for the execution of the same - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred & eight,

of the said Executrix, or into the hands, and possession of
any other person or persons for her; and the same so made
do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexan-
dria when thereto required by the said Court, and the same
Goods, Chattels and Credits; and all other the Goods, Chattels,
and Credits of the said deceased, which at any time after
shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said
Executrix, or into the hands, and possession of any other person
or persons for her; do well and truly administer according
to Law; and further do make a just and true Account of
all her doings and doings therein, when thereto required by
