 Bryan and Josiah Emmet are held and firmly bound to George Giffen Bryan
 Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia
 and his Successors in office in the Sum of five hundred Dollars, to which
 payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors in
 said sum does, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally, jointly
 By these presents, dated with our seals and dated the 20th day of December 1803
 The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound, Hannah
 Langston, administratrix of all and singular the goods, Chattels and Credits of George
 Bryan deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all said singular
 the goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the
 hands of possession or knowledge of the said administratrix, and the hands
 and possession of any other person appearing for her, and the same do make to
 deliver unto the said Orphans Court when there required by the said Court,
 and the same goods, Chattels and Credits, do well and truly administer according
 to Law, and further do make a just and true account of all her doings and
 return when there required by the said Court - and all the rest

of the said goods, Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of
 the said administratrix the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge
 of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively
 as are entitled to the same by Law; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last
 Will and Testament, was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court
 and the Executor obtain a certificate of the Probate thereof; and the said administratrix
 do in such case being required by the Court deliver up her Letters of Administration
 then this obligation to be void she to remain in full force
