ing her natural life or widowhood. 2 Item I will and bequeath
to my son William Hussey, whose now in his apprenticeship that we
shall have the sum of twenty dollars at his coming to age as also my
other three sons which is here with me, Simon Hussey, Henry Hussey
and George Hussey, at the age of twenty one. 3 Item I will also that
what cash I have in hand with notes of hand and all outstanding acts
shall be appraised and appropriated as the rest of my personal prop-
erty. If my wife should intermarry she shall relinquish her right
to all only what the law will allow her, at the decease of my wife
all that I may have at that time shall be equally divided among
all my children or as many of them as shall be living then.

Item I will that wife Jane Hussey shall be administrator
with Reason Thomas administrator to set to the conducting of my
Worldly affairs as also to the raising and settling of my children out of
the above mentioned property. Signed sealed and delivered in
the presence of John Trammell this eight day of September in the year
four thousand one thousand eight hundred & six.
