in burial and my soul to God who gave it this Jesus Christ my Lord
Amen. Item, my will and desire is that my dear and well
beloved wife Jane Rappay should have and hold all my estate du-
ring her natural life or widowhood. 2 Item I will and begeth
to my son William Rappay, who is now in his apprenticeship that he
shall have the sum of twenty dollars at his coming to age as also my
other three sons which is now with me, Simon Rappay, Henry Rappay
and George Rappay, at the age of twenty one. 3 Item I will also that
what cash I have in hand with notes of hand and all outstanding debts
shall be appraised and appropriated as the rest of my personal prop-
erty. If my wife should intermarry she shall relinquish her right
to all only what the law will allow her - at the decease of my wife
all I have or may have at that time shall be equally divided among
all my children or as many of them as shall be living then.

Item I will that wife Jane Rappay shall be administrator
with Reason Thomas administrator to act to the conducting of my
worldly affairs, as also to the raising and schooling of my children out of
the above mentioned property. Signed, sealed and delivered in
the presence of John Brammell this eight day of September in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & One -

or possession of the said guardian as soon as the said Orphan shall
attain lawful age whether thereto required by the said Court and
also shall well and truly save harmless and indemnify the said
Judge of the said Court and his successors from all trouble and damage
that shall or may arise about the said estate then this obligation to be
void else to remain in full force and virtue.
