In the name of God Amen, I Mary Helen late Sumner in hand of the British Majesty Ship the prince of Charlotte, commanded by the Honorable St. J. Gordon being now in the town of Alexandria & district of Columbia in the United States of America, and being at this time sick and weak in Body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of Human life, do hereby and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, Whereas during the time I lived on board of his Majesty Ship aforesaid she took sundry prizes, to wit, the Ship, St. Michael Archangel Flaguilla, commanded by Anthony Pelagius belonging to Spain and bound to Barcelona, and sent into Port Royal in the Island of Jamaica and Condemned; Also a brig, La Regulas a french Privateer commanded by John Matthews sent into Jamaica to the same port as above. Also a Spanish Brig, Nuestra Señora Del Rosario commanded by James Salinas and sent into the aforesaid port in Jamaica. Also a Spanish Ship, commanded by Rodo Casandrea sent into the same place. Also a Spanish Brig called St. Vincent Ferrer commanded by her Captain to carry and sent into the same port aforesaid; Also a Spanish Ship called

Lindsay, James Kingston, & McKnight the former two my Will and I have are, and I do hereby bequeath unto my friend and more Mrs. Nancy Hulls of Alexandria in the District of Columbia in the United States of America all the Shares dividends, proportion, share or Shares which I have or are entitled to from the above prizes; Also I will and bequeath unto the said Nancy Hulls aforesaid all my worldly Goods and Chattels, Lands and Tenements and all and singular any Movable Estate Real personal and mixed wherever the same may be found, and which I am entitled to, in law and to hold the same to her the said Nancy Hulls and Her heirs Executors, Administrators or assigns forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and subscribed second day of November in the Year of our Lord Eighteen hundred five. And hereby revoking all former wills by me made. I appoint the said Nancy Hulls my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament signed, sealed, published by the above named Charles Sumner who has hereunto subscribed and sworn to.

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria
in the District of Columbia the 10th day of May 1806, This last Will
and Testament of Henry Mitten late a Seaman on board his Britanic Majesty's
Ship of War Hancock (Charlotte) St. J. Gardner Commander, was produced to the Court by
Jenny Mullen the Executrix thereof named, and proved in due form of Law by Thomas
Woodhouse and William J. Pick two of the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
