The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Eliza Timmerman, and John Timmerman, administrators and administratrix of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of Harry Timmerman deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the knowledge or possession of the said administrators and administrators or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for them and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court, and the same goods, chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make a just and true account of all his actions and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court; and all the rest of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrators and administrators the same being first examined and allowed by the Judges of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament of was made by the deceased and the same be proved in court and the executor obtain a certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Administrators and administrators do in such case being required by the court deliver up their letters of Administration then this obligation to be made oblige to remain in full force.
