said Judge and his successors in office, we bind ourselves our Heirs Executors  
and Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed  
with our Seals and dated the second day of June 1810

The Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the said James Sanderson Administrator of the goods chattles and credits of William Somes Hall deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattles and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator or into the hands of possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court, at such times as he shall be thereto required by the said Court, And the same goods chattles and credits do well and truly administer according to law, and make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein when thereunto required by the said Court, and further do well and truly pay and all the rest of the said goods chattles and credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law, And if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the decedent and the same be proved in Court and the executors obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Administrator do in such case bring a quietus under and deliver up his letters of Administration. Then this obligation to be void etc to remain in full force
