revenue of my Estate & property Real personal due from the Navy Department of the United
States of America and due or that may at the time of my decease be due from the same
a daughter unto my Sister Elizabeth Diblois second Daughter of my Brother Lewis
Diblois of Alexandria District of Columbia in said United States —

Lastly, I name and appoint Christian Dalton Esq. of Washington in said
District of Columbia & Lewis Diblois of Alexandria aforesaid the Executors
of this my last Will & Testament —

At a Session of the Ophorus Court for the County of Alexandria in the District
of Columbia the nineteenth day of April 1805, This last Will and Testament of
James S. Diblois deceased late prisoner on board ~~now~~ the United States Frigate
Constitution, was produced to the Court by Lewis Diblois one of the Executors
therein named and proved by the Death of Nathaniel Morris who made oath,
That he is well acquainted with the hands Writing of the Testator, and that the said
Will and Signature thereto are wholly written by him. That the hands writing of
James Wells John Hall and Robert Greenleaf are well known to this deponent, and
that their Signatures as witnesses to the said Will is in their own proper hands writing,
That at the time the Witnesses subscription names this instrument was in the hands of the before
said Lawyer, where the Testator was lying sick, but he was of sound mind and
memory at the time the said Will was executed. Whereupon the same is directed to
be certified until further proof of the Validity of same will be produced to the Court.

At a Session of the Ophorus Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia
the 23rd day of May 1805, this last Will and Testament of James S. Diblois was
further proved by the Oaths of Christian Dalton and William Estey to be in the hands
willing of the Testator, And agreed to be avoided —

Chattels and Credits of Robert Brown deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come
to the hands of the said Administrator into the hands and
possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made to exhibit unto the
said Court when there required by the said Court. And the same Goods Chattels
and Credits do well and truly administered according to Law; and further do make a just
and true account of all his Writings and things therein when there required by the said Court;
(And the same Goods, Chattels) And all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which
shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administration, the same being first
examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall determine and
pay unto each person respectively as are entitled to be same by law and if it shall hereafter
