The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Cadwallader I. Wade Administrator of all and Singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of James Park deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands of person or knowledge of the said Cadwallader I. Wade and the hands and possession of every other person before his heirs and the same so made to exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when there required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattels and Credits to will and leave Administer according to Law and further to make a just and true account of all his Actions and damages therein which shall be required by the said Court and all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively whom entitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that my last Will and Testament was made by the Personed and the same is proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the Probate thereof and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his letters of Administration then this Obligation to be void also to remain in full force.
