

In the Name of God Amen. I James Russell of Alexandria, in the District of Columbia Merchant being sick & weak in body; but of sound & perfect mind & memory, (Blessed be God for the same) Do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following To-wit: Principally & first of all I commended my Immortal Soul, into the hands of God who gave it, & my Body to the Earth, to be buried in a decent & christian like manner, at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named; and as to such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, in this life; I give & dispose of the same in the following manner. That is to say -

It is my will & I order, I direct that all my just debts & funeral expences shall be first paid by my Executors hereinafter named, out of my personal Estate, but if by any unforeseen accident or otherwise, my personal Estate shall be insufficient, to discharge my debts, I maintain, clothe & educate my Children; & as my debts chiefly consist of negotiable paper, in the Bank of Potomac & in the office of discount & deposit, at Washington, all endorsed by John Tucker, with one other note in the Bank of Alexandria, endorsed by Joseph Riddle, & as it is my desire that these debts shall be immediately paid with as little inconvenience to my Endorsers as possible. It is my will that my real estate shall be forthwith sold for these purposes & therefore I do hereby authorize and empower my Executors hereinafter named to sell such part or parts, or the whole of my Real Estate if necessary, for the purposes aforesaid, as they at their discretion may think proper, & to convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers, their Heirs & assigns, as fully as I, myself, might or could have done. And touching all

The rest, Residue & Remainder of my Estate, Real, Personal & mixed, of what kind & nature soever, the same may be, or wheresoever found, I give, bequeath and devise the same unto my two Sons, Thomas Russell & James Blackburn Russell, To hold to them their Heirs & assigns forever as Tenants in common, & not as Jointenants; But if either of my said Sons, should die under age, or without lawful issue, the Survivor to hold the share of him so dying. And lastly I nominate, constitute & appoint my two trusty friends, James H. Hove, of Fairfax County in the State of Virginia & Trueman Brashears of Alexandria aforesaid to be the Executors of this my Will; Hereby revoking all other Wills, Legacies & bequests by me heretofore made, & declaring this & no other to be my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the twelfth day of October, in the Year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred & eight.

Sealed with our Seals, and dated this 1st day of November 1808.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that if the above bound James H. Hove and Truman Brashears Executors of the last Will and Testament of James Russell, deceased, do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Executors, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them; and the same so made, do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, when thereto required by the said Court; And the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which at any

Time after, shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Executors, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for them; do well and truly administer according to Law; and further do make a just and true account of their doings and doings therein; when thereto required by the said Court; And also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said last Will and Testament; as far as the said Goods, Chattels & Credits, will thereunto extend, and the Law shall charge. Then this Obligation to be void, else to remain in full force.
