 I Wesley Gunnell of the County of Alexandria and District of Columbia being of good health and sound mind and memory thank to a gracious Providence
 Do make this my last Will and Testament revoking all other hitherto made by me
 First I will that the following Signers shall be my executors Dick Davis, James and Phillipa shall be free as soon as they shall each arrive to the age of forty years each of them, if there should be no law to the contrary, but if there should be a law prohibiting a general emancipation, then in that case they shall be equally divided between my four Children, that is to say, Sally P. William, and their Heirs forever, if either of my Children should die before without issue then these Signers shall go to the surviving Brothers or Sisters and to their Offspring forever - The rest of my Signers are to be equally divided amongst my Children in the same way and after as above directed, having no regard to any law that may be or shall be made in the subject of emancipation, but I wish my Children to have all the discretion in their power to establish a principle of general emancipation, but I speak it my duty to give them all the young ones married or otherwise to do as they please with giving them an opportunity to show what principles they are governed with - Still my wish and desire is that all the rest of my Estate both real and personal shall be equally divided amongst my Children and their Heirs forever, without any exception; and as there may be some difficulty in dividing the Land, if they can't agree among themselves, I wish them to choose three reasonable and disinterested men to divide it for them - and above all things I earnestly beseech them not to get to law, no污染防治 nor even bring on a Litigation, but leave with pleasure what are affectionate Mother and Friendsly Father both set and take care of for you - And lastly I wish all my debts paid and for you to receive all that may be due me, at this time save nothing of consequence and my wife stand fair but it may not be the case when this will shall come on you -
