I do constitute and appoint my friend Henry Thompson merchant of Baltimore my sole Executor, hereby annulling and revoking all former wills heretofore made or executed by me. The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that if the above bound Henry Thompson Executor of the last Will and Testament of John Foster deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of the said Henry Thompson or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria at such time as he shall be thereunto required by the said Court, and the same goods, chattels and Credits and all other the goods, chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which at any time after shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of the said Henry Thompson or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him, do well and truly administer according to Law. And further do make a just and true account of his doings and things therein, when thereto required by the said Court, and also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said last will and Testament as far as the said goods, chattels and Credits will thereto extend and the law shall charge. Then this obligation to be void and of none effect etc to remain in full force and virtue
