Know all Men by these Presents that the said William Duane and Thomas Swann are held and firmly bound unto George C. Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia and his successors in office in the sum of ten thousand dollars to the payment whereof well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our Heirs Executors and Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Signed with our Hands and dated this 11th day of June 1806.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound William Duane Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of John Smith deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court; and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law; And further do make a just and true account of all his acting and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court; And also the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as we are entitled to the same by law and if it shall happen that any last Will and Testament was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his Letters of Administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia holding the 11th day of June 1806 the parties to this Deed acknowledged the same to be their act and deed and it was ordered to be recorded.
