The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound John McLeod Guardian of John Rising his Executor and Administrator do and shall well and truly pay unto the said Orphans all such Estate and Estates as now or hereafter shall come to the hands or possession of the said John McLeod as soon as the said Orphans shall attain lawful age, or when the same are agreed by the said Court, shall well and truly save harmless the said Judge and his Successors from all trouble and damage that shall or may arise about the said Estate then this Obligation to be void and of none effect else to remain in full force and virtue
