First I give to my wife Catherine Sumner as long as she lives my Wife's my House and Lot which was on in Alexandria but if she in her life time change the same the said property is to be given up to my Son John if he should choose to keep it and pay to the other three of my Children their equal shares of the property according to its valuation then to be made up to each of them one fourth of its value my House and Furniture I give to my wife for her own natural Life and at her Death to be divided Share and Share alike among my four Children as witness my hand this sixth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & two Philip Sumner
