of fifteen thousand dollars to my niece Adeline Watts  
daughter of Edward & Elizabeth Watts. I give and  
devise to my niece Elizabeth Boulle ten thousand dollars.  
I give and bequeath to my niece Sarah Boulle three  
thousand dollars. I give and bequeath to my nephew  
in George Watts son of Henry Watts one thousand dollars.  
I bequeath to my nephew Henry in C. son of Henry Watts  
one thousand dollars. And I do hereby request that  
Mr. Mary Newes, wife of Aaron Newes of Alexandria  
shall have the superintendance of Adeline Watts my niece  
and shall be allowed to bring her up until she be married  
or arrived at full age; and provided my said niece  
shall be allowed to be brought up by and live with  
the said Mr. Newes until the period of marriage or of her  
attaining her full age, or until the death of Mr. Newes, then  
it is my will that the expenses attending her mantenance  
education until her marriage or arrival at the age of  
twenty one years shall be paid by my executors of my estate in  
addition to the legacy herein before given.  
I do hereby devise to negro Adam the sum of sixty  
dollars a year during his life payable quarterly.  
I devise to my brother Henry Watts all my household  
and kitchen furniture and my wearing apparel.  
I devise to my friend Dr. Peter Wise three  
hundred dollars. I do hereby emancipate my negro  
woman Anna after the expiration of three years from the  
date hereof and do leave to her an annuity of Fifty dollars.

may remain of my Estate I leave to my nieces and  
nephews to be equally divided amongst them.
