Imprimis, It is my will and desire, and I do order, and direct, that all my just debts and funeral charges be fully satisfied and paid,

Item; I give unto my wife Jane during her widowhood all my estate, both real and personal; and in case that she marry again, then I do give and devise unto her during her natural life full compensation and satisfaction of dower in my estate, the lot dwelling house and improvements, whereon I now live upon Wolfe street and my house and kitchen furniture
