

In Gods Holy name - Amen. I Joseph
Marie Perrin, born at Lyon in France, my father name
Robert Perrin, my mother name Pierrette Begiziat, now a
citizen of the United States of America and Resident in the town
of Alexandria, where I have lived upwards of twenty years,
Do make and give and declare this instrument which is
written with my own hands, to be my last will and testament
revoking all others by me made or intended to be made -

Item 1st I will bequeath to my beloved Brother Mathurin
Perrin all my real property to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my said Brother Ma-
thurin Perrin for and during his natural life only, all my per-
sonal property of every sort and description, and after his decease
it is my will that the same remain to the use of my ^{nearest} relations
in France on my said father's side, either specifically as the
said personal property may stand at the time of my decease or
the value thereof in money according to the discretion of my
said Brother Mathurin Perrin, whom I hereby constitute
and appoint my sole Executor to carry this my last will into
effect -

Item 3rd I hereby enjoin it upon my said
Executor, to settle and pay all debts justly due from me either
individually or as member of the firm of Perrin Brothers trading
in Alexandria, this fifteenth day of June in the year one thousand
eight hundred and five - 15. Jun 1805 -

Codicil to my last will.

Joseph M Perrin being in my perfect senses and
having my recollection perfect, do hereby make this Codicil to
my last will, and do hereby declare it to be my will, that the
personal estate devised by my will aforesaid to my Brother Ma-
thurin Perrin, for and during his life natural life only shall descend
to him and his heirs forever as well as my real estate before mentioned
It is also my will that my said Brother Mathurin Perrin

have and enjoy forever my estate I may have in Europe
real personal or mixed. Signed with my own hands
this twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and eight -

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alex-
andria in the District of Columbia the 19th day of March
1808. This last will and testament of Joseph Marie
Perrin and the Codicil annexed thereto were proven by the oath of
Jonathan Mandeville, Anthony Charles Gaymover, and John
Richler, to be wholly written and signed by the testator, and or-
dered to be recorded - and letters testamentary were
granted to Mathurin Perrin the executor named in the said
testament - Test Alex. Maas Esq^r

Know all Men by these presents that we Mathurin Perrin
Anthony Charles Gaymover and John Richler are held and firmly bound
unto George Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the
County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia and his successors
in Office in the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars to the payment
whereof well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his suc-
cessors in Office we bind ourselves our heirs executors and ad-
ministrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed
with our seals and dated this nineteenth day of March 1808 -
The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the
above bound Mathurin Perrin Executor of the last will and testa-
ment of Joseph Marie Perrin deceased, do make or cause to be
made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chat-
tels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the
hands possession or knowledge of the said Executor or into the hands
and

and possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same to make do exhibit unto the Orphans court for the County of Alexandria at such time as he shall be there unto required by the said court, and the same goods, chattels and credits and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased which at any time after shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Executor or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly administer according to law; and further to make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court - and also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said last will and testament as far as the said goods, chattels and credits will therunto extend and the law shall charge - then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force and virtue.
