The Conditions of the above obligation is such that if the above bound John Chapman administrator of all and singular the goods chattels of Nathaniel Chapman deceased domestic slave and personal inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made deliverable to the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when there to required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law and further do make a just and true account of his doings and things therein when there to required by the said Court and all the rest of the said goods chattels and credits which shall remain owing upon account of the said Administrator the same being first examined and allowed by the said Court for the same being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the deceased and the same be proved in court and the executor obtain a certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administrator do in such case being required deliver up his Letters of Administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force.
