

At a Session of the Orphans Court of Alexandria County the 13th day of April 1803.

Administration of the Estate of James Craig Senior Deceased having been granted by the Corporation Court of Alexandria on the Twenty fifth Day of September 1795, to James Craig the Father of the Deceased, and the said administrator not having rendered an Account of his Administration.

It was on the above Day of the Orphans Court, ordered that the said administrator be cited & summoned to appear before this Court on the Second Tuesday in June next to show cause why he has not rendered such an account;

In consequence of which order the said James Craig this Day appeared at the registers office and being duly Sworn gave the following Statement: - That when the said James Craig Senior departed this life, all the personal Estate he had consisted of attired, Shop Furniture, and Medicine, to what Amount or value he cannot ascertain, nor did he ever think it necessary he should make any appraisement of them, as he was Security for the Payment of the Money they were purchased for, and since the Deceased Death has paid the same, and every Debt he owed; in speaking of the said Shop Furniture and Medicine being all the personal Estate of the Deceased his clothes are excepted, of which the said administrator

Saith he considered it unnecessary to render any account for the reasons above mentioned.

Memorandum:

The Policy of Insurance mentioned in the Appraisement returned, being on the Deceaseds Commissions on a Voyage to the West Indies, but he died before the Voyage was ended & no Commissions could be recovered; Upon enquiry Wm B Magruder owed nothing of the £400⁰⁰ mentioned in the Appraisement but bought the Deceased in his Debt; And a Suit is depending against the Estate of John Fitzgerald for £700⁰⁰ mentioned in the appraisement of which it is supposed nothing will be recovered, and refers to the proceedings in the Suit for the particulars of that Case
