 it to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands
 of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent
 Christian burial at the discretion of my wife, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, And as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give
 devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and force

First I give and bequeath to my dear wife Caroline the sum of what Money
 Estate together with all my Household Goods, debts and moveable effects, these
 during life - Whose heirs portions out of this life whatever she left to be
 divided justly and equally between my said Thomas and John Parley by her
 single power of their own election, nothing and confirming this and in other to be my
 last Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and three

 cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels
 and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession
 or knowledge of the said Caroline Parley into the hands and possession of
 any other person or persons for her and the same do make do exhibit unto
 the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria at such time as she shall be thereto
 required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattels and Credits and all other the Goods
 Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased which at any time after shall come
 to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Caroline Parley into the hands
 and possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly administer
 according to Law. And further do make a just and true account of all her doings and
 doings therein when thereto required by the said Court and also shall well and truly
 pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said last Will as
 far as the said Goods Chattels and Credits will extend and the law shall charge
