being no executor named therein, is granted to Catherine  
France the having good Security in the following Bonds  
of £1500<sup>00</sup> Wall. And by these presents that we Catherine France  
Richard Huott and Peter Talsipungo are held and firmly  
bound to George Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for  
the County of Alexandria, and his Successors in office in the  
sum of three hundred Dollars, to which payment well and  
truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors we bind  
ourselves on his Executors and Administrators, jointly and  
severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our Seals and  
Witnessed the tenth day of August 1802. The condition of  
the above obligation is such that if the said Catherine France Ad-  
ministerer with the will annexed of full and singular the  
Goods, Chattles and Credit of Philip France deceased, to make a  
true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattles and  
Credit of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the hands  
possession or knowledge of the said Catherine France or into the  
hands or possession of any other person or persons for her, and the same  
so made to exhibit into the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria  
when there required by the said Court, and the same Goods, Chattles  
and Credit do well and truly administer according to law &  
And further do make a just and true Account of all her actions and  
deeds therein when there required by the said Court, and all the  
rest of the said Goods, Chattles and Credit which shall be found  
remaining upon the Account of the said Administrator the  
same being first examined and allowed by the Judges of the  
said Court for the time being shall settle and pay over  
such Proportion respectively as are intituled to the same

by Law, then this obligation to be void the remainder in full force.
