Philip France of Alexandria, being at this time weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament, First I give to my wife Catharine France as long as she lives my Widow, my House and Lot I now live on in Alexandria, but if she in her life time changes her name the said property is to be given up to my Son John if he should choose to keep it, and pay to the other three of my children their equal Shares of the property according to its valuation then to be made viz to each of them one fourth of its value, my Household Furniture I give to my wife for her own natural Life, and at her Death to be divided Share and Share alike among my four Children, as witness my hand this sixth day of July in the year of our Lords one thousand eight hundred & two. *Philip France*

Know all Men by these presents that we Catherine France Richard Hewitt and Peter Tatsingunghe are held and firmly bound to George Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, and his Successors in office in the Sum of Three hundred Dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors we bind ourselves our heirs Executors and Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents, Sealed with our Seals and Dated the Tenth day of August 1802. The condition of the above obligation is such that if the said Catherine France do administer with the Will annexed of said and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Philip France deceased, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Decedent, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Catherine France or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her, and the same so made do exhibit into the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court, and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law. And further do make a just and true Account of all her doings and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the Account of the said Administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judges of the said Court for the time being shall Receive and pay away such Sum or Sums respectively as are entitled to the same
