 of sound and disposing mind, do make and declare this to be my  
 last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former and other Wills  
 by me made; Imprimis it is my will and desire that all my  
 just Debts be satisfied & paid, and for that purpose I do hereby  
 authorize & empower my Executors herein after named or  
 the Survivors of them, to sell and dispose of any part of my Estate  
 either Real or Personal, for the payment of all or any part of my debts  
 as they may think most conducive to the Interest of my Estate.  
 Item I give and devise unto my two Children Maria &  
 William, all and Singular my Estate Real and Personal to be  
 equally divided between them subject to the legacies hereinafter  
 mentioned; and if my <sup>Wife</sup> Margaret shall survive them  
 and in that case, it is my will and desire that such Child or Chil-  
 dren shall each have one full equal part of my Estate both real  
 and personal <sup>with my said daughter Maria & William</sup> ~~with my said daughter Maria & William~~  
 Spectual. Item it is my will and desire that my beloved wife  
 Margaret shall have the sole use and profits of all my Estate both  
 real & personal during the Minority of my said Children, and also one  
 full third part of my said Estate during her natural life, and I do  
 hereby give and devise the same unto her accordingly, but it is hereby  
 intended to be the meaning and intention of this devise that my  
 said Wife Margaret shall Educate and Maintain my said Chil-  
 dren during their Minority, without any charge for the same on their  
 respective portions of my Estate, and it is my will & desire that each  
 Child shall receive their respective portions of my Estate as they  
 respectively attain to their Age. Item I do hereby constitute &  
 Appoint my Loving Wife, Guardians of my said Children, and she  
 also constitute and appoint her Executors and Nathaniel Willets  
 Executors of this my last will and Testament.

 The indentured part of my Father John Maguadee's Estate had in his lifetime  
 during his life, and also a further Debt, part of which to me by him which  
 will in other ways in my possession or received in Justice's office.  
 One Debt to George Swan for which I have Thomas Willets bond  
 to secure the same to me, and in the hands of John B. Maguadee  
 One House and lot in the Town of Alexandria on Fairfax Street, conveyed  
 to me by Thompson & Welch valued at £500.  
 One Lot in George Swan's lot to me by my Father John Maguadee

There is a long unreturned account with Thompson & Welch which was given  
 and settled and Geo. Taylor then was double insurance made on the post-  
 chaise from London, my Insurance was made first, which I think  
 the Insurance made by Thompson & Welch was given without my knowledge or consent  
 amounting to about forty pounds Sterling. The other three are principally for  
 Bills of Exchange which Geo. Taylor is well acquainted with & some dry goods from  
 the Store; I have no account with them not being able to get their account;  
 I sent on Thompson & Welch some time ago to order to my Credit \$150  
 paid Insurance to the Bay of Honduras on the Ship "Pat" Chief Mr. Welch  
 took the policy and agreement & put these in his own chest and did not make  
 the bill of - there being an account between Tom's Thompson, George Taylor &  
 myself against the post-choise chief we agreed to have it to William Herbert and  
 James Bruce Nicholls, they agreed that Mr. Thompson should pay me  
 somewhere about \$100 for his proportion of the dividend. Mr. Taylor

settled my account with R. Holt P. Weston last May at which  
 time there was no Interest due on either side or charged; Thompson  
 & White furnished us with 600 Barrels flour for the Schooner Mary  
 to the West Indies, which was to be remitted to London on discount,  
 and was remitted accordingly. I drew on R. Holt P. Weston for New  
 Orleans for upwards of \$5000 which was invested in Cotton & Sugar, and  
 was to be held up for a Market on my arrival here, the Plan was  
 got from Thompson & White to enable us to do so but immediately  
 on my sailing from here the Cotton was sold and sacrificed at  
 27 Cents per lb Cash, when it was selling much higher to the North  
 ward; on looking at my account some days ago, I find they have  
 charged me \$249 some Cents Int. which charge I took upon as  
 unjust, I purchased from them the first of March 4000 Bushells  
 Corn to load the Mary; from Mrs. Madsen's letter from Mexico  
 it appears that they ought to pay me for 13 days' carriage of the  
 draft they detained waiting for the Corn, at whatever two Ships  
 Service shall see it ought to be.

Know all Men by these presents that the Margriet Maguire George  
 Taylor and Nathaniel Watters are heirs and joint and several Bond and George  
 Collier Just. Judge of the orphan Court of the County of Henrico, in  
 the District of Virginia were sitting, and her deceased in the Sum of Twenty  
 thousand Dollars to the payment whereof and truly to be made  
 we being sureties one and each of our Heirs Executors and Adminis-  
 trators health and severally jointly by these presents Sealed with our  
 Seals and dated this 17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1806:

The condition of this obligation is such that if the said Margriet Ma-  
 guire Administratrix, with the Will annexed of the Goods Chattels and  
 Philip Maguire Deceased, do make and pay the sum of Twenty thousand Dollars of  
 the said Deceased which here or shall come to the hands of  
<sup>her Heirs</sup> or of her the said Margriet Maguire, or of the hands of any  
 other person or persons for her and the same so made  
 is added into the orphan Court when she shall be there required by  
 the said Court and such Just. Chatter and Creditors do well and truly  
 administer according to Law and further to make a just and true ac-  
 count of her doings and things therein when there is required by the  
 said Court, and all the cost of the said Just. Chatter and Creditors, which shall  
 be found reasonable upon the Account of the said Administratrix, the  
 same here committed and allowed to the Judge of the said Court for the time  
 being shall show and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to  
 the same by Law. Then this obligation to be void and remain in full force.
