The being a favorite & very busy Slave in my Family whom I wish to be excluded from sale. After the payment of my just Debts and funeral Expenses I give all the real & personal Estate both Real & personal as well as all future accreting of property whether Real or personal to be equally divided between my two Sons William Henry Washington & George Alexander Washington to have & to hold the same to them their Heirs Executors administrators & assigns forever. All the rest & residue of my Estate both real & personal of what nature it kind or interest may be not herein before particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided between my two Sons William Henry Washington & George Alexander Washington which I give to them their Heirs Executors administrators & assigns forever. And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my Nephews & Friends Charles Davis of Loudoun County & George Chapman Junr of Woodrowville in the County of Prince William both in the State of Virginia Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby renouncing all the aforesaid Will & Testament by me heretofore made. Sealed with our seals and dated the 3rd day of December 1805.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Elizabeth Logan Administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Randolph Logan deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Elizabeth, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her, and the same so made exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court, and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make a just and true Account of all her doings and doing therein when thereto required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administration the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto each person respectively as are entitled to the same by law and yet shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administration do in such case being required deliver up his letters of Administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force -
