presents, Sealed with our Seals and dated the first day of  
May 1809.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if  
the above bound John Smither, Administrator of all and singular  
the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Rebecca Greenway deceased  
do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the  
Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or  
shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Ad-  
ministrator, or into the hands and possession of any other person  
or persons for him, and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans  
Court of the said County when thereto required by the said Court.  
And the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, do well and truly  
administer according to Law; and further do make a just and  
true account of all his actings and doings therein when thereto  
required by the said Court; and all the rest of the said Goods, Chat-  
tels and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon account of  
the said Administrator, the same being first examined and allowed
