pounds Sterling each, to be paid to them when of age by my Executor, to be
employed in the meantime in the best manner for their advantage, &
should any of the above Legatees die before they are of age it is my will
that their share should revert to my Sister Margaret Battlement
Item I give and bequeath to my Niece Rebbecca Edwards two hundred pounds
Sterling to be remitted to her uncle James Douglass, & put to Interest
until she is of age & this to be done by the first safe conveyance
Item I give & Bequeath to my Sister Margaret Battlement all the residue
of my Estate of whatever kind, and to her heirs, but in the event of her dying
without having any children I desire it may revert to my next nearest
relations to be equally divided among them & should the Children of the
said Margaret Battlement die without Issue, I will & desire in that case
it should also revert in the manner before expressed - I do further con-
stitute & Appoint Hugh Smith Notch of Alexandria my only
Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
