The Condition of the above obligation is such that, Whereas on the fourth day of June 1807, On the application of Septimus Loring an of the Representatives of Mary Weston dec'd the Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, ordered Alexander Moore the Register of Wills for the said County to take possession of and safely keep all the personal estate of the said decedent, until administration thereof should be granted if the same should be necessary. And whereas by a subsequent order of the said Court notice was given to the Representatives of the decedent to take possession of the said estate, which they will refused to do. Whereupon the Court ordered the said estate to be publicly sold by the Marshal of the District of Columbia conformable to law, which sale was to have been made on this day. Now if the said Joseph Thomas shall and will save harmless and indemnify the said Judge and all others who have been concerned with the said estate in consequence of the same being surrendered unto him the said Joseph Thomas, and shall also pay and satisfy all the expenses which have occurred upon the said estate then this obligation to be void: it to remain in full force.
