Whereas it has been represented to this Court that Peter Guss has lately departed this life and that Michael Bailey has taken possession of fifty Dollars in Cash, the property of the Deceased, and that he has effects in the hands of Peter Guss - It is ordered that Lewis Summers Remains and take possession of the said Money and Effects or of any other property of the Deceased he can find and keep the same in his hands till the further order of this Court, to prevent the waste and Embolvement of the same

Know all Men by these Presents that we George Penick & John Longdon are held and firmly bound to George Giffin Esq^r Judge of the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia and his Successors in office in the Sum of one thousand Dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successors we Bind ourselves, our Heirs Executors and administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these Presents, sealed with our Seals and dated this twentieth day of June 1803 - The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above Bound George Penick, administrator of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Edward Penick deceased, unadministered in the County of Fairfax, do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said ~~deceased~~ which have or shall come into the hands or possession or knowledge of the said George Penick or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same so made do exhibit unto the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, when thereto required by the said Court, and the same Goods, Chattels, and Credits do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make a just and true account of all his doings and things therein when thereto required by the said Court, and all the rest of the said Goods Chattels and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon account of the said administration the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was made by the Deceased and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a Certificate of the Probate thereof, and the said administrator do in such case being required by the Court deliver up his letters of administration, then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force
