

Know all Men by these presents, that We Elizabeth

Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the
district of Columbia and his successors in office in the sum of one
thousand dollars, to the payment whereof well and truly to be made
we bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors
and Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these pres-
ents, Sealed with our Seals and dated this 17th day of
January 1807.

The Conditions of the above ob-
ligation is such that if the above bound Elizabeth Lightfoot and
Samuel Lightfoot Administrators and Administrator of all and
singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of John Lightfoot dec^d
do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and
singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which
have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Elizabeth
Lightfoot and Samuel Lightfoot or into the hands and possession of any
other person or persons for them, and the same we make do exhibit unto
the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria at such time as they shall
be thereto required by the said Court, and the same goods, Chattels
and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law, and
further do make a just and true account of all their doings and
doings therein when thereto required by the said Court, and all the rest of
the said goods and Chattels which shall be found remaining upon
account of the said administration and Administrator the same being
justly demanded and allowed by the said Court, shall deliver and pay
unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law;

And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament

was made by the deceased and the same be proved in Court and the executor obtain
a certificate of the probate thereof, and the said Administrators do so each as
being required by the Court deliver up these letters of Administration, then this
obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

I Impriois: It is my Will and desire and I do order and direct that all my just
debts be fully satisfied and paid and in case that my personal estate shall not be
sufficient to discharge my debts, I do order and direct my executors hereinafter
named, to sell so much of my late property and upon King and Patrick Streets as
will be sufficient for that purpose. I then I give and devise unto my wife
Elizabeth and her heirs and assigns forever my late property upon King and Patrick
Streets and all the houses buildings and improvements thereupon, and all the rest and
residue of my estate real & personal wherever it may be and of whatever it may consist
I give unto my said wife her heirs and assigns forever. Lastly I nominate and
appoint my wife Elizabeth and my friend John Hunt executors and administrators of this
my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke and annul any will or wills her-
etofore made by me. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 12th
day of January 1807.
